

Items	Details
Knives	Any objects with a sharp edge capable of being used to cause serious injury (except for plastic or round bladed butter knives) , including fruit knives, scissors, kitchen knives, sashimi knives, reaphook, scythes, box cutters, table knives, folding knives, surgical knives, etc.
Objects with a sharp point or sharp edge	Any objects that may cause puncture, including bow and arrows, large fishhooks, metal nail longer than 5cm, dart, metal knitting needles, staple guns, medical injections, etc.
Sticks, Tools and Agricultural tools	Any objects that may be used to hit or may cause puncture, including all kinds of material's sticks, hoes, hammers, axes, screwdrivers, metal harrows, awls, saws, chisels, ice burins, large fishhooks, iron chains, metal ruler with a thickness of more than 0.5mm, camera tripods (leg diameter size is more than 1cm and the height after folded is more than 60cm), metal nail longer than 5cm, darts, strong slingshots, metal vernier calipers, etc.
Guns	All kinds of toy guns and other goods as proscribed in the Act for Controlling Firearms, Ammunition and Knives that could be used as weapons as approved by competent authorities, including guns, canons, knives, batons, police handcuffs, electric shocks, etc.
Sporting goods	Any objects that may be used as weapons, including bats (baseball, softball, cricket), golf clubs, hockey sticks, pool cues, speed boards, kayak and canoe paddles, lacrosse sticks, bows and arrows, decorated swords, chainsticks, skate boots and spikes.
Liquids Gels Aerosols	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. For passengers who travel on international flights, liquids, gels and aerosols will only be allowed in hand baggage or carry-ons if they are kept in containers with volumes of not more than 100 ml each. These containers must be carried in a clear, re-sealable plastic bag. The total volume of the bag must not exceed 1 liter. Each person is allowed to carry only one plastic bag. All objects that is not allowed as the regulation listed above should be put in check-in baggage. 2. Passengers who bring other necessary liquids, gels and aerosols, such as baby food or baby milk, medicines, others for essential medical purposes that the amount is exceeded than regulations should be declared and approved by security agent from Aviation Police Bureau before objects being brought on flight in hand baggage or carry-ons.
Others	Other dangerous articles that may affect flight safety after manipulated.

Note1 : Syringes that need to be used during the journey for medical purpose are allowed to be carried on flight. Passengers should declare them to the security agent of Aviation Police Bureau at Security Check Line.

Note2 : Electric shocks that contain explosives, compressed gas or lithium-ion battery should not be placed in hand baggage, carry-on baggage nor checked baggage.
